Pastor's Message Based on Flight

"Although King Herod had laid careful plans to destroy the newborn King of the Jews, as the wise men referred to the Christ, the all-wise and almighty Lord did not lack ways and means to protect Him from his jealous fury. First, He directed the wise men in a dream to return to their own country without reporting back to Herod. When Herod then destroyed the lives of all children under two years of age in the town of Bethlehem in hopes of destroying the hated child, Jesus was already out of his reach, because Joseph had been directed by God to take Him and His mother to Egypt. Holy Family Cited As Pattern

"The holy family is a pattern for all Christian families," was the truth emphasized by Pastor Harold Brauer, in his sermon delivered in St. Paul's Lutheran church, Twenty-eighth and Quincy, Sunday. "There is much that both parents and children can learn from Jesus and his parents, Joseph and Mary," he stated, basing his remarks on Luke 2:41-52.

"Like the parents of Jesus, so Christian parents today should be vitally concerned about both the physical and spiritual well-being of their children. But they should be careful to keep the proper balance between these two. While the physical care of children is important, the provision for the spiritual training of children by precept and example is an even more important responsibility of parents. This training in Christian truths and practices should have its foundation in the home. That is where God placed the responsibility.

"Like the child Jesus, children of today should be subject, or obedient and respectful, to their parents and all others who have authority over them; they should grow especially 'in favor with God and man,' namely, strive to walk in God's ways so that not only God will be pleased with them, but also those who meet and know them will like them, and they should be about the 'Father's business,' hearing His word, doing His will, and putting into practice His precepts."

Finally, a sincere Christian faith thinks through its relation to God and Christ in terms of the life to which the individual is accustomed, and confesses that faith in the individual's own way and words. Recreation Gift Includes Tables, Chairs and Rugs

As a part of its youth assistance program, Ogden Kiwanis club has donated furnishings for three recreation rooms at the state school for the deaf and blind. It was announced today by Dr. George S. Stewart, chairman of the boys' and girls' committee of the club.

The gifts include tables, chairs and rugs for the reading and lounging room, game and reading room and a kitchen, where students may prepare refreshments for their social functions.

By augmenting basic furnishings of the rooms, the gifts will enable the students to broaden their social activities and make the quarters more attractive and convenient, Mr. Stewart said.

Tells Appreciation

Supt. Boyd E. Nelson of the

school said he, the staff and students were happy to receive this cooperation from the club. "It means a great deal in furthering the social education of students, and shows that the community is anxious to accept the students as citizens. The spirit in which it is given probably means more than the actual physical donation," Mr. Nelson added.

As an example of the community-mindedness engendered among students by such gifts, Mr. Nelson revealed that pupils, free of any solicitation, had taken up a collection for the Friendship Train. The students show an unusual willingness to do their part in Red Cross and other campaigns, he said, because they are anxious to reciprocate for the kindnesses shown them.

Among the older students who will have access to the newly-furnished rooms, Mr. Nelson continued, are members of the boys' Arthur Wanger Athletic association and the co-educational Park Literary society.

Raise Own Funds

Boys of the A.W.A.A. raise their own funds for purchase of athletic equipment and entrance fees into leagues by operation of a candy store at the school and other means. They are allowed almost complete freedom in the management of their affairs, the superintendent explained.

Probably the next youth-assistance activity of Kiwanis, according to Dr. Stewart, will be a book drive among members to supplement the students' library at the deaf and blind school.

Dr. Stewart recalled that a similar drive conducted last year for the Utah state industrial school netted over 250 volumes. Similarly this campaign was conducted after the Kiwanis club had furnished recreational quarters for boys at the industrial school.
